Board member Marcella Mayhew posing with the winner of the slogan contest, Grevden Cooper. His captivating pro-life slogan was "Don't we all deserve life?".


Albert Johnston **Scholarship Opportunity**

Anika Howell, 2025 Albert Johnston Scholarship Winner



Following are excerpts from Anika's essay which display her pro-life conviction. She additionally fulfilled all scholarship requirements (as set out elsewhere in this newsletter).

From an early age, I remember supporting my older brother, lain. lain has Down Syndrome and Autism. He has required a high level of behavioral and personal support in order to function as he currently does, but completing many daily tasks still requires a lot of effort from

him. When I was five years old and in elementary school with my brother, adult supervisors came to me once for help in getting lain off the playground. I knew what to do; I picked up a small tree branch, and told lain he could have it if he came down. He came right away, and we both went to class late. As lain's sister, I have known him better than many, and thus have had many chances to support him. I continue to help lain in a different way than most siblings might help their neurotypical siblings; this has instilled in me the value of the lives of disabled people.

Another past experience which impacted my values is my mom's work. When my brother and I were quite young, she would often leave home late for night shifts at the hospital, then sleep during the day. During these days, we would rarely see her. This was a significant sacrifice; she had to carefully plan meals and childcare around her care of the sick and dying at the hospital. Although this is no longer her position, her dedication to this work taught me to care about those who are at the ends of their live.

Throughout her essay, she gives further instances of her involvement – interacting with seniors at her church and in care homes bringing joy to them through her singing, assisting with the Special Olympics BC Winter Games, and supporting two special needs young adults at a summer music program.

In conclusion, she writes "Thus, I have learned to value the lives of those who are elderly, disabled, or otherwise vulnerable. I hope to continue helping people such as these in the future. I have learned that relationships should be giving, that I live a life free from the many struggles which others face, and that my faith has strengthened my ability to help others... People matter – all of them."
